**History Firsthand** (various titles and editors). First-person accounts that take readers into the personal experiences of people who lived during that time. Titles include *The Middle Ages*, *The Civil War: The North*, *The Civil War: The South*, *The Great Depression*, and *Japanese Internment Camps*.

This series of books, subtitled "A History in Documents," includes reproductions of documents, illustrations, photographs, engravings, posters, prints, and other sources. Titles include *The Depression and New Deal*, *The Gilded Age*, and *The Struggle Against Slavery*.

Bush*; *We Interrupt This Broadcast, 3E: The Events That Stopped Our Lives...from the Hindenburg Explosion to the Attacks of September 11*; *President Kennedy Has Been Shot: Experience the Moment-to-Moment Account of the Four Days That Changed America*; *World War II on the Air: Edward R. Murrow and the Broadcasts That Riveted a Nation*.
